hawkeye II by Persistent Surveillance Systems

Persistent Surveillance System's president Ross McNutt was tasked with discovering a way to prevent roadside IEO's in IRAQ whilst in the USAF. His solution was to attach amazingly high resolution cameras to aerial vehicles and take a picture every few seconds. When an IEO detonated, it was possible to view a picture of the explosion; and then scroll back through the archived photos to the time when the bomb was planted. By scrolling back in time through surveillance photos, US troops followed suspects back to their homes from the bomb site, conducted raids, and arrested occupants.

Upon returning to civilian life, McNutt marketed this system to law enforcement for use in "the resolution of criminal acts." Several U.S. cites have now been under the watchful eye of PSS, Inc.'s all observant system, including Philadelphia, Dayton, and Baltimore.

What's this about?

Surveillance Drone Action Figures are fully customizable 3D models of surveillance vehicles currently in service across the continental United States. The aim is to promote awareness of, and dialogue about, emerging surveillance techniques.
